We welcome children to the autumn term and a new academic year. We are already 3 weeks into the new term as we enjoy some late 'summer weather'. There is much going on as Steventon Children's House continues to grow and develop.

New starters

This has been an extraordinary term as far as new starters are concerned. We have 12 new children starting this term. We welcome Raffi, Elsie, Daniel, Lottie, Lola-May, Mika, Sebastian, Rosemarie, Hetty, Johnnie, Millie (and Nolwenn who will be joining us next month). All the children have settled in really well. Even in the first few days I was able to stand and watch as a room full of children, half of whom were new, were occupied with their chosen activity, not a sound, just happy faces and looks of concentration.

The down side to this is that we have not been able to keep up the 'At school today I....' forms for very long. Doing sometimes 7 or 8 of these forms in one morning, requires one member of staff all morning and I feel our hand writing may not have been readable in some cases. I am sure you will understand that after the first couple of weeks we felt it was not the best use of our time. We can do 2 in a morning so if you are ever concerned about what your child gets up to or you are encountering behavioural or health related issues for example let us know and we are always happy to complete in the forms for you.

Montessori Training

In conjunction with the 'Montessori Partnership' we are starting to run 'Montessori assistant' courses from Steventon Children's House. In order to be able to run these courses we have had to be able to prove that we are a high standard Montessori setting with a wide range of Montessori activities available to the children. Sheena, Heather and Sindy and possibly a teacher from another setting will all be starting this term. Synthetic Phonics -Presentation to parents

On Monday 28th at around 12.40 pm Marianne will be doing a short presentation to parents on how we learn letter sounds at Steventon Children's House as part of the Montessori language curriculum. It is an opportunity to find out more about us as well as to ask questions and help provide more consistency between home and nursery.

We are also considering organising regular information evenings/afternoons on other aspects of Montessori education open to the wider community not just existing parents. Your views on timings and topics would be welcomed.

We are now offering the option after Christmas if there is enough interest.
